As part of our Creative Curriculum this half term, classes have been taking a trip around the world! The theme has been Communication Around the World, and classes have been incorporating this in all their lessons. In Bay Tree class, pupils have sailed the seven seas with their Literacy story, The Snail and the Whale. They have been amazing at learning the signs alongside the story, and loved using them to retell the story to all their friends. They have also been working on communicating, using their pencil control skills to write messages just like the snail in the story.

This half term, Maple Tree Class have been working hard at their new jobs... they have all become post office workers! After reading Katie Morag Delivers the Mail, they decided they could help people to communicate with each other by writing and posting their very own letters. They made sure they carefully wrote the correct addresses so that the letters didn't get lost. Pine Tree class have been learning all about the news this half term, and how this helps people know what is happening all around the world. Pupils took on the role of weather reporters to tell people what the weather is like around the country. They did their own version of 'Good Morning Pear Tree' and using varied communication such as, switches, talkers, signing and verbal communication were able to tell us what was happening in the world. Watch out Susanna Reid, Pine Tree are coming for your job!

In Upper School, pupils have been discovering what life is like in European countries and joining in signing to different folk tales... our favourite was about the witch Baba Yaga. It was really spooky, and got us in the mood for Halloween!

Finally, this half term Elm Tree's Science lessons have been out of this world! Pupils have learnt how important satellites are for facilitating communication around the world, and they loved exploring shadows and using shadow puppets to tell stories.
